In the AFI poll, it was named the most famous film quote of all time, but it almost never happened. It took months for David Selznick, the film's producer, to get the word of past movie censors. Before it was approved, other versions of the quote were also taken into account, including Frankly, I don't care. 2 The Wizard of Oz was released in 1939. The Wizard of Oz was priced into the film for According to the Library of Congress, it's the most watched film in movie history. While the flick is filled with memorable lines (Follow the yellow brick road, and Toto, I have a feeling that we are no longer in Kansas are good examples), there is a lineup from the final scene - There is no place like home, which is in its own league. 3 Seven-year-old Itch Despite starred in close to 30 films, the film most associated with the blonde actress will forever be a seven-year-old itch. The scene where Marilyn Monroe's dress explodes while standing over a subway tube has a permanent place in pop culture. The image inspired Halloween costumes, countless shops and artworks. The actual suit from the venue was auctioned in 2011 for \$5.6 million. 4 Breakfast at Tiffany's Without a single word mentioned during the nearly 3-minute clip, the opening scene of Breakfast at Tiffany's is one of the most famous opening sequences in film history. It was said to have been difficult to record (for reasons ranging from Hepburn's flashy pastry to Fifth Avenue), but Julie Andrews, the director's widow, revealed that the scene was shot in one shot on the set of the 50-year-old film. 5 The Sound of Music How many of you tried to teach this scene after arriving at the open field? Although the studio was the last choice for the role, Marlon Brando brilliantly revived Don Corleone, jaw and all that. The film begins by introducing us to famous gangsters as he caresses his cat. Some fun facts: The cat was actually a tramp, and Brando wore a mouthpiece that took three hours to check in. The prop is currently on display at the Museum of the Moving Image in New York. 10 Frankenstein All it takes is two words (It's Alive!) to remind the film buffet of this memorable scene, which depicts Frankenstein's monster coming to life. The story itself has been available for close to 200 years, and since then it has found its way into pop culture countless times. From more movies to books and TV shows, the story of Frankenstein will be alive forever. 11 Jaws If you're afraid of sharks, you can thank this movie. The special effects in the 1975 film don't, of course, appear as sophisticated as those in today's films, but we think the film remains daunting - especially the scene You'll need a bigger ship. 12 Singing in the Rain One of the most iconic dance numbers in film history, Gen Kelly's 1952 performance, singing in the rain set the bar for musicals. Every element of this scene is an iconic moment in the history of film. The film, of course, tells a much bigger story about World War II and Pearl Harbor, but it was this one by the beach that became a cinema treasure. 18 Breakfast Club After Downsizing Stereotypes of high school clicks, the last scene of Breakfast Club is one to be remembered. It's hard MTV.com to think about this movie without imagining immediately that Judd Nelson would pump his fist into the air, but after that gesture, it wasn't written into the original script. Nelson improvised a trunian's posture during filming. 19 Scar We've all heard this line, whether we've seen Scar or not. As Al Pacino's Tony Montana prepares to fight rivals who have inhaled into his house, he shouts at the famous line. He even landed on AFI's list of the top 100 film quotes. 20 Madam and stray mention the spaghetti scene to anyone, and they will know exactly what you're talking about. This Disney classic is over 60 years old, but everyone still loves watching this story of puppies of love, especially this clip. The film's most famous scene, however, almost didn't happen. Walt Disney took it from the first movie stories. Walt wasn't sure it was going to be a very clean scene. Watching a young Leonardo DiCaprio whisk Kate Winslet on the bow of a married Titanic has been raving movie lovers since 1997. We'll never get tired of watching Jack Dawson hold Rose's arms when he stretches his arms and declares, I'm flying! 25 Princess Bride The opening scene of The Princess Bride sets the tone for a imagined but romantic film.
